172 Prime Hoggs

A stronger showing of quality forward with finding numbers hard across the UK. All weight grades are in demand, with meat needed for strong sales. SQQ 298.17p/kg. NK Butcher topped the day with best end Texels at 313p/kg for 45kgs hoggs, also topping the day overall with 50.5kgs to £147.97.

Highlights - R Hall & Sons topped the Suffolks for the day at 309p/kg for 38.5kgs finishing a quality run of Continental cross hoggs under 40kgs all to 292p/kg; Hadley Farms penned their usual stamp of Continental hoggs with 42kgs to 310p/kg and 45kgs to 309p/kg for best finished shape hoggs.

Anything of any frame was over £100, with longest term sorts in the mid £90's, very long term Easycare ram lambs were sold at £61.

Ewes with Lambs

D Blunn penned a quality run of Suffolk Mule ewes, double theaves with best end Texel lambs at foot selling to £95 a life.

In-Lamb Ewes - LS Hammon continued to draw quality on their annual consignment of scanned triplets with their full mouth and 6tooth North Country Mule ewes in-lamb to a Charollais and due from the first of April sold to £142.

56 Cull Ewes & Rams

Trade was on fire with a quality showing of ewes forward. Culls averaged £113.94! Weight and meat was once again driving the trade with serious premiums for best shape. J & M Ironmonger penned the best seen run of Texel ewes with highs of £206, £190, £163, £149, £149 and £136; M Digweed saw comparable highs with meat Texels selling to £178, also topping the Suffolks on the day to £124; FG Belcher & Sons topped the Mules on the day with ewes to £105. All meat ewes were above £90, with feeders or chancy types at a step below.


