Prime Hoggs

Another lift in trade this week with the SQQ at 385p/kg, not reflecting the available premiums, all in average saw £176.65. All meat saw high demand with trade hard for lean meat types. L Blackman & Son topped with a best end showing of Texel crosses seeing a high of 439p/kg for 49kgs hoggs also topping the day overall with 58kg Hoggs to £226 or 390p/kg.

Highlights - SJ & RE Helliwell topped the lightest hoggs on the day with Beltex at 39kgs selling to £158 or 405p/kg, with followers to £147 and 36kgs to £140; Raveley Fen Farms penned a sterling show of Charollais seeing their 45kgs selling to £192.50 and 428p/kg; P Stiles topped with Charollais crosses to £182 for 45.5kgs for best meat; R Law saw a pen of smart meat Texels at 43kgs sell to £175; Pentelow Farms penned a best finished run of meated Continentals seeing 49kg Texels to £205.50 or 419p/kg, with their best sold hoggs as Mules to £190 for 53.5kgs; RC & JT Bailey penned a quality run of Continentals topping to 400p/kg for 50kgs best meat. Ewes & Lambs - the sun drew the crowds with a sterling show of all grades forward. LC Threadgold & Son saw the trade of the day with a Grade 4 Dutch Spotted ewe and triplets selling to £162 a life or £648 the outfit, followed by a Blue Texel and three lambs to £130 a life or £520 the outfit; P & KF Chapman penned another top end run of quality with Grade 4 Dutch Spotted ewes and single lambs topping at £150 a life; Everdon Elite saw a best end sale with Shetland theaves and single lambs topping to a fantastic £75 a life. SFI Update

DEFRA have been monitoring the impact of the following options, which take land out of food production:

- IGL1: Take improved grassland field corners or blocks out of management
- IGL2: Winter bird food on improved grassland
- AHL1: Pollen and nectar flower mix
- AHL2: Winter bird food on arable and horticultural land
- · AHL3: Grassy field corners and blocks
- IPM2: Flower-rich grass margins, blocks or in-field strips


As of 26th March 2024, there will now be a cap of 25% of a holding able to be entered into these actions. According to DEFRA, these actions were designed to be carried out on smaller areas within land parcels and are less effective if they are carried out on larger areas, and the impact on food production is greater.

The cap comes into effect immediately for any applications submitted going forward. Existing agreements, and applications submitted before midnight on 25th March are unaffected.
