REPORT FOR THURSDAY 26TH OCTOBER

589 Prime Lambs

On the whole a strong trade with best meat lambs finding clear premiums. Once again week on week store lambs and lean lambs should only be sold at the Saturday Store Sale for the VENDORS benefit. The SQQ levelled to 250.86p/kg. Export types and heavy meat flew today with WF Knight & Son topping overall at £156 for 64kg Continental Charollais, with their run of 49kg lambs across all three pens selling to £139 or 284p/kg.

Highlights - W Veal topped the lighter lambs with their Texel crosses to £118.50 for 45.5kgs; George Thompson Farms saw their usual stamp of Continental lambs sell to £118 for 43kgs for best meat; F & SM Stamper drew their usual goods with Beltex crosses at 43.5kgs topping to £117 and 43kgs to £115, only to be outdone by the heavies at 52kgs selling to £145; M Wilkinson had a top draw of meated quality seeing their Charollais crosses at 51kgs sell to £140; WG Childs & Sons had another draw of quality with Texels to £136.50; J & V Short had their first draw of the season with a real show of Texel power topping to £130 for their first three pens at 52kgs, 51kgs and 50.5kgs; JLB Farming topped their run of Texel crosses to £146 for 63.5kgs

Trade looks to have eased in recent weeks, but it's a true reflection of the final draw of ewes from farmers. This weeks average saw £76.56. J Towers topped the day with thick Continental ewes at £129; SJB Luckett topped with a smart draw of Texel crosses of lean meat and big frame at £120.50; Fineseasons saw the best of the Suffolks with meat ewes at £120; D Sansom had a pearl of a Beltex small in frame but best shape selling to £118. Meat and weight saw a run of seventeen pens all over £100. E Sansom & Sons topped the Mules for the day with big framed meat ewes at £98, well bred part meat ewes were in the £80's with true feeders of the right breed in the £70's, longest term ewes were still seen at £65.

SHEEP VENDORS

New Veterinary Attestation rule for farmers to be introduced on 13th December 2023.

Action Needed Now.....

What's changing?

Changes in legislation, as from 13th December 2023, will require all producers selling livestock for slaughter to have had an annual farm veterinary visit to allow their animals, and/or part of any animal, to be exported out of the UK. The purpose of the new rule is to comply with EU export requirements to verify the absence of notifiable disease and provide general advice on farm biosecurity.

Why is this changing?

The Statutory Health Attestation is required from the 13 December 2023 to certify exports of POAO (Products of Animal Origin) to the EU. The EHCs (Export Health Certificates) require that the animals' farm of origin has undergone regular visits by a veterinary surgeon.

What do producers need to do?

Producers will be required to obtain a signed declaration from their vet that the visit has taken place. The veterinary attestation template can be found here: <u>veterinary</u> <u>attestation template</u>. This should be signed and completed by the farm vet.

Obtaining a signed veterinary attestation must be done at least once over a 12month period and can be combined with any other routine veterinary visit, including government supported initiatives such as the Animal Health and Welfare Pathway in England.

Farmers and vets must keep a copy of their completed declarations and the "unique reference number" created, for their records and to provide to their livestock auction market or meat processor.

Farms that are part of qualifying assurance schemes do not need to complete the veterinary declaration. Membership of these farm assurance schemes is accepted as evidence that a premises of origin meets the requirement for regular health visits from a vet.

The qualifying schemes are:

- Annual health and welfare review (England only)
- Quality Meat Scotland (QMS)
- Farm Assured Welsh Livestock Beef and Lamb Scheme (FAWL) (Welsh Lamb and Beef Producers Ltd (WLBP))
- Red Tractor

W Hammond topped the day with Suffolk cross shearling rams to £205 with a Beltex cross to £150; I Birden drew another smart show of Grade 3 Dutch Spotted ewe lambs selling to £160 for well marked lambs and £140 for darker sorts; Webb Hatherley Livestock saw a quality showing of powerful full mouth ewes seeing their pens of Mules all sell to £132 and Texel crosses to £130; R Paton saw the start of their flock dispersal of Easycares with double theaves at £92 and flock age at £85.

Store Lambs - week on week buyers build momentum with a strong show of genuine lambs forward. All in average £81.55. WG Childs & Sons topped the day with Charollais and Texel lambs of big frame and part meat selling to £113, £109 and £107; M Kellet had a smart show of Texels forward with lambs to £111 and £108; M Wilkinson topped their run of Texels to £105 for the best shape; H Houghton & Son saw their first draw of the season with Suffolk Mule lambs flying to £102.50; GH Rome & Son saw another first draw with Texel Mules of big frame selling to £101, £89.50 and £89.50; AC Downing penned a smart run of Continentals selling to £99. Any lambs with frame were in the £90's with smaller well bred lambs in the high £80's, very few were seen at £78 or below with ram lambs looking £10-£15 less than comparables.

Feeding Ewes - looking dearer on the week with many looking to ewes instead of lambs this season. All in average £66.48. GWM Farms Ltd topped with Texels to £114 with following smart sorts at £108, £105, £103 and £97; JR & J Bradford topped the native breeds with Jacob rams to £108 and Dorsets to £95; JD & JA Miles & Sons topped the Mules for the day with big framed ewes to £77. Native bred types smaller in frame were seen in the £60's, with the longest term chancier types in the high £50's.

A 9 year old Jack Donkey sold to £360. Over 500 lots of tack saw a good number of buyers for all sorts that went under the hammer, best things sold were Rugs, Coats and Boots.
