The Market Report

May 2023 Professional Ponderings

Climate change is ever present in all aspects of life and the letting of property is no exception with government policy pushing owners of let property to improve energy efficiency to help reduce CO2 emissions. We have talked before about the Minimum Energy Efficiency Standards (MEES) where landlords can no longer let a residential property, where the Energy Performance Certificate is below Band E. It is also worth highlighting that the government has been consulting (consultation now closed) on tightening the regulations even further for private rented properties.

We are still awaiting the results of the consultation, but it is worth noting that the proposals are just that, at this moment in time, and no regulations have been drafted yet. However, the main proposed changes within the consultation were as follows:

- Minimum EPC rating to be raised from an 'E' rating to a 'C' rating If agreed, the plan is to enforce this from 1st April 2025 for new tenancies, and from 1st April 2028 for existing tenancies.
- Cost cap to be raised from £3,500 per property to £10,000 per property, in relation to funding improvements.

A "Fabric first" policy is to be introduced – The proposals look to control
which improvements are to be carried out first. For example, improvements
to the fabric of the property (i.e., insulation, windows & doors) must be
undertaken before other works are considered.

Commercial property is also caught by the MEES regulations and from 1 April 2023, landlords must not continue to let any commercial buildings which have an EPC rating of less than E unless the landlord registers an exemption.

There are several possible exemptions to the MEES regulations which need to be registered on a central database. Certain exemptions such as the third-party consent exemption will need supporting information, and in the case of historic buildings it is likely that evidence will be required to show that the building can't reach EPC band E without a detrimental impact on the historical value of the building. Property owners can't simply rely on the fact the building is listed as an automatic exemption. Exemptions will last for 5 years and then a further exemption will need to be applied for.

HUNTINGDONSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL - NEW LOCAL PLAN

Huntingdonshire District Council have agreed to start the preparation of a full update to their Adopted Local Plan which will set out how the District will grow over future decades. The Local Plan will set out a plan for future sustainable development in the District and it will perform two specific roles.

- Identify key areas of land for development to deliver homes, jobs and services needed in the District, and
- Include Policies against which all future planning applications will be considered.

Part of the review of the Local Plan will include a Call for Sites exercise which will run until Wednesday 7 June 2023. Landowners are being invited to submit sites with potential for:

- Residential use (such as housing, specialist homes, moorings, care homes etc.)
- Commercial use (such as retail, leisure, industrial, logistics etc.)
- Infrastructure (such as health uses, community facilities, renewable energy etc.)
- Open Space use (such as sports and recreation, allotments, biodiversity net gain, flooding safeguarding etc.)

For sites to be included in the Local Plan they must be capable of delivering five or more dwellings for residential sites, or 0.25 hectares (500 sq m) for commercial sites. We will be submitting sites on behalf of landowners to this process, along with supporting information and if you should have any land which you feel should be promoted through the Emerging Local Plan then please contact a member of the Planning and Development Team and we will be happy to assist you.

BEDFORD LIVESTOCK SHOW – MICHAELMAS 2023 DATE - SATURDAY 23 SEPTEMBER 2023

After the turmoil caused by Covid over the last few years and the very successful 2021 Bedford Christmas Show, followed by the cancellation of the Fatstock Dinner, to avoid holding a Covid "super spreader" event, the committee have met to consider their options for the future.

It has been decided that, rather than merging with the Thrapston and Northampton Christmas Fatstock Show, Bedford Show should retain a separate event, in order to retain our independence and identity. It is therefore proposed to hold a Bedford Show at Michaelmas, to be hosted in Thrapston Livestock Market on Saturday 23rd September 2023. It is proposed to move the focus away from prime finished stock, towards breeding and store stock and animals will be judged according to potential, as well as finish. Our main objective is to hold a successful Show and, whilst exhibitors will be able to offer their animals for sale on Show day, they will not be required to sell, in order to claim their prizes.

We will be sending out letters to potential sponsors, judges, etc, over the coming weeks but, if you are interested, we would ask you to speak to a member of the committee, in order that we can gauge the level of support. Entry fees and prize money will be set at the same level as the successful 2021 Christmas Show.

We hope that you will support this event, which will be open to all local farmers and, hopefully, will reflect the proud spirit of independence shared through the whole of the county of Bedfordshire.
