Trade eased slightly on the week with more numbers forward nationally. SQQ 340.5p/kg and entries this week saw a best showing of range with all weight and conformation on show. R Hall & Son topped the day with Texels selling to 347p/kg for 42kg. B Burrows & Sons topped the day overall with an unbelievable entry with a 59kg mid-February born lamb selling to £159.30.

Highlights – Walters Partnership topped the lightest lambs with Charollais at 34.5kgs flying to 339p/kg, with their 37.5kgs to 337p/kg. J Bourne & Son topped their lighter lambs with their 37kgs selling to 338.5p/kg. B Burrows & Sons saw a storming trade for their Charollais with 40kgs selling to 346p/kg, and Suffolks to 344.5p/kg for 42kgs. TR Tame & Son saw their saw high for their quality continental crosses with 41.5kg Charollais selling to 344p/kg.

EJ Farmer saw a sterling run of Beltex and texel crosses forward with highs of 310p/kg for 36.5kgs hoggs, and topping overall for their 53kgs at £137.27. Highlights – CJ&L Vernon Miller continued with their usual stamp of quality with small Beltex hoggs at 36kgs selling to 276p/kg and their 33kgs to 266p/kg. T Young saw a sterling trade for their Texels reaching 300p/kg for 45kgs. Baylis Farming saw some of the best trade for the heavies with 56kgs topping to 240p/kg.

BEDFORD LIVESTOCK SHOW – MICHAELMAS 2023 DATE - SATURDAY 23 SEPTEMBER 2023

After the turmoil caused by Covid over the last few years and the very successful 2021 Bedford Christmas Show, followed by the cancellation of the Fatstock Dinner, to avoid holding a Covid "super spreader" event, the committee have met to consider their options for the future.

It has been decided that, rather than merging with the Thrapston and Northampton Christmas Fatstock Show, Bedford Show should retain a separate event, in order to retain our independence and identity. It is therefore proposed to hold a Bedford Show at Michaelmas, to be hosted in Thrapston Livestock Market on Saturday 23rd September 2023. It is proposed to move the focus away from prime finished stock, towards breeding and store stock and animals will be judged according to potential, as well as finish. Our main objective is to hold a successful Show and, whilst exhibitors will be able to offer their animals for sale on Show day, they will not be required to sell, in order to claim their prizes.

We will be sending out letters to potential sponsors, judges, etc, over the coming weeks but, if you are interested, we would ask you to speak to a member of the committee, in order that we can gauge the level of support. Entry fees and prize money will be set at the same level as the successful 2021 Christmas Show.

We hope that you will support this event, which will be open to all local farmers and, hopefully, will reflect the proud spirit of independence shared through the whole of the county of Bedfordshire.


