REPORT FOR THURSDAY 21ST SEPTEMBER

578 Prime Lambs

A two tier trade with meat hitting strong highs in the 270's, with lean lambs hard penalised in the 220's. Weight demand has increased again with lambs 45kgs plus in demand. SQQ 251.24p/kg. Grange Farm topped the day with a sterling show of Beltex lambs at 40.5kgs selling to £112.50 or 278p/kg; L Blackman & Son topped the day overall with best meat Charollais Continentals at 55kgs selling to £142 with their 48.5kgs to £129.

Highlights - W Hammond had a smart show of Beltex lambs forward with 45.5kgs topping to £122; George Thompson Farms saw their usual quality of Continental lambs forward with highs of £122 for 45kgs and £128 for 49.5kgs; DO Threadgold topped their best end Texels to £129 for 47kgs with their 55.5kgs flying to £140; C Stancombe & Son drew a well finished run of Texel Mules with 45.5kgs to £121, 50kgs to £127 and 53.5kgs to £132.

REPORT FOR SATURDAY 23RD SEPTEMBER

Store & Breeding Cattle

Cows & Calves - Prices sold to £1380 for a 14 year old Limousin cow with two 3 month Limousin calves at foot for David Self; C Harrell sold an Aberdeen Angus heifer with a Hereford calf at foot. To £1170.

Store Cattle – Prices topped at £1700 for both steers and heifers, J Bottesch with a 21 month Limousin steer and GR Fountaine with an 18 month British Blue heifer; R Munns sold 23 month Aberdeen Angus steers to £1670; JTG & PA Harris sold a 27 month Aberdeen Angus steer to £1640; DG Short sold a 27 month Hereford steer to £1470; Charles Hopperton sold a 21 month Aberdeen Angus steer to £1440; T Prowse sold a 10 month Limousin steer to £1360. An 18 month Limousin heifer from Charles Hopperton sold to £1110. Bulls from J Bottesch sold to £1020 and £1000 for 12-15 month Limousins.

Calves – Thirty-five calves forward today saw the Champion British Blue heifer calf sell to £460 from JEG James; WJ Robinson sold British Blue bulls to £330, Aberdeen Angus heifers sold to £290 for AG Burton.

Pigs – Three pigs forward sold to £150 for Padray Farms.

Goats – Five Boer Nannies with two Boer kids at foot sold to £165 from £132 to average £48.50 a life.

Prime Sheep – Prices topped at 391p per kilo or £176 for 45kg lambs from GR Fountaine, with his others weighing 46kg at 326p; SJ Hubbard sold 45kg lambs to 278p; Cartwright Farms sold 49kg lambs to 261p; JEJ Harrison sold 49.5kg lambs to 257p.


