REPORT FOR THURSDAY 16TH FEBRUARY

278 Prime Hoggs

Best meat hoggs saw a top end trade. A far greater showing of lean hoggs forward this week with vendors penalised hard, these types would be better sold on a Saturday in the store sale. SQQ 221.89 p/kg. Corney and Sons topped with best meat Charollais hoggs at 45.5kgs selling to 233p/kg; Cambridge University Farm topped their run with Suffolk hoggs selling to £122.50 for 60kgs.

Highlights – Corney & Sons saw top end prices with 52kg Charollais to £115, 50kgs to £112 and 44kgs to £102; G & J Rattray topped their run of Charollais crosses seeing 50kgs sell to £114; C Stancombe & Son penned the usual goods with Texel crosses topping to £114 for 50.5kgs, 49kgs to £113 and several pens of 48kgs to £110; C & W Murdoch continues with a top quality draw of Continentals selling to £121 for 57.5kgs and £115 for 54kgs with their lighter weight 47kgs selling to £108.50.

71 Cull Ewes & Rams

Trade sees top end prices once again with meat and weight seeing premiums. On the whole prices took a lift with a great variation of ewes forward. Average £83.12. RM Barnett topped to £113 for a Continental ewe; Grange Farm topped the Suffolks for the day with meat ewes selling to £110 with Texel crosses topping to £98; Thornby Farms saw a smart run of Texel crosses forward with the best at £110, leading to £98 for followers; Cambridge University Farm topped the Mules for the day with big framed heavy meat ewes selling to £97.50; NS Seamark & Son saw £94 for their ewes of a similar stamp. Lighter types with some meat were seen in the £70's, with lean ewes sub £60.

FARMING EQUIPMENT & TECHNOLOGY FUND

New round of Farming Equipment and Technology Fund (FETF):

With DEFRA currently producing new information on the rollout of new and existing grants available to farmers and landowners, we have now had information on the Farming Equipment and Technology Fund as part of the Investment Fund available in England for farmers, foresters, and growers.

Grants are available between £1,000 and £25,000 for equipment that assist in improving land's productivity, sustainability and to improve animal health and welfare on farm. The new round of grants for Productivity and Slurry items under FETF will open towards the end of February, while Animal Health and Welfare items will open in March, following on from a successful first round in Late 2021.

Annexe 3 and 4 outline eligible items of equipment that are available, with a few examples including:

- Direct Drill with Fertiliser Placement 3m this would contribute up to £25,000 based on an estimated cost of £68,000.
- Robotic Silage Pusher this would contribute up to £5,800 based on an estimated cost of £14,500.
- Heat and Service Detector contribute up to £438 based on an estimated cost of £1,095.
- Badger Proof Lick Holders contribute up to £68 based on an estimated cost of £170 per holder.

Funding will be allocated on a score assigned basis in relation to how well the applicant meets the scheme's objectives. As part of the second rollout, the list of items available within the grant has been significantly multiplied, including 66 more items to support animal health and welfare, as well as 19 to aid productivity and 2 items to support slurry management.

DEFRA strongly advise that, should applicants have not been successful in receiving funding in the first round of applications, they should not be deterred in applying again for this second instalment. Each item is given a clear grant value, and following a successful application, the item can then be bought, with the grant money being paid after the item is received and installed (where applicable). It is encouraging that the second rollout of FETF has been issued, and we look forward to providing further guidance on the future of ELMS as we transition away from direct payments. 

Store Lambs - a flying trade with all lambs forward topping to season highs. Quality throughout the pens this week, with buyers keen to fill orders for all goods. All in average saw £81.89. M Towler topped the day with big framed Lleyn ram lambs selling to £108, with followers at £102.50; S Tunnicliffe penned smart Texel bred lambs showing short term promise to £100, with their mates selling to £98.50 and £90; DTA Tomkins had their first draw of the season with Texel crosses topping to £99.50 with smaller frames to £88.50; M & M Hutton topped short term compact lambs to £90; LA Burton saw their Lleyn Texels of their usual stamp reach £88 with the leaner sorts to £85 and £76.50. Well bred lambs but longer term were seen in the £70's with very few in the £60's at all.

Feeding Ewes - a day to remember with both quality and prices unbeaten anywhere else. All in average saw £102.64!! Woodview Farm topped the day with Charollais selling to £147 for the first pen and £143 for the following; KA Titmus saw comparable highs with Texel rams reaching £131 and Suffolk rams to £119, with their Suffolk ewes at £115; R Truss topped the Suffolk ewes on the day selling to £117 with Texel crosses to £115; S Gawthroup penned a smart Charollais ram selling to £113; M Towler drew a tidy run of Lleyn rams and ewes, with the rams reaching £110 and the ewes topping to £108. Very few entries saw sub £90 with weight and size commanding the trade.
