The Market Report Professional Ponderings – September 2024

To start on a positive note, as per the latest Propertymark survey to the end of June 2024, using data provided by Agents across the United Kingdom, tenant demand has increased steadily month on month since March 2024. This may be partly due to demand continuing to outstrip supply, with around 9 new applicants registered for each available property in June 2024 and stock levels decreasing slightly.

Rental figures per calendar month across the whole of the UK do continue to rise and in June 2024 the average UK rents were 8.6% higher than in June 2023. However, rents continue to fluctuate depending on individual markets & regions.

As we enter the third Month under a new Labour government, we as Agents and members of Arla Propertymark, are constantly updated regarding proposed legislation affecting the rental sector that may come into force.

The Labour government have already indicated they have put renters' rights back on the agenda through the introduction of its Renters Rights Bill. The proposals Labour are carrying over from the Conservative's Renters (Reform) Bill and new proposals are shown below:

- Abolish Section 21 "no fault" evictions
- Expand possession grounds, so properties can be reclaimed when needed
- Strengthening tenants' rights & protections
- Giving tenants the right to request a pet

Trade was easier on the whole, SQQ 284.99p/kg. PM Bonner topped the day pence per kilo at 297p/kg for best end Texels at 50.5kgs. Lloyd & Walton topped the day overall at £161 for best finished Charollais crosses at 56.5kgs.

Highlights - RD Holland topped their lighter lambs with 45.5kgs Texel crosses to \pounds 131; J Towers saw a smart show of Texel crosses at 45.5kgs to \pounds 130; Corney & Sons penned their first draw of the season with 59.5kgs Charollais to \pounds 160, 50.5kg and 49kgs Charollais to \pounds 145; C Stancombe & Son penned a best meat show of Texel Mules at 48kgs selling to \pounds 140.

NFU SURVEY

NFU are currently conducting a **<u>survey about tail docking and castration in</u> <u>lambs</u> to help inform discussions with the government on potential new restrictions.**

We kindly ask that you complete the survey, and share the survey with your customers, to gather vital information on the impact of any proposed restrictions to the current practises of tail docking and castration within both farming businesses and the lamb market.

Please see full details and the survey link below.

Tail docking and castration in lambs is considered necessary to manage negative health and welfare impacts caused by fly-strike, or to avoid unwanted pregnancies and complications during post-slaughter processing.

Both procedures are permitted in the UK and governed by legislation however, the <u>Farm Animal Welfare Council's report</u> released in December 2022 discussed the implications of castration and tail docking (which are in the legal terms described as mutilation procedures) on the welfare of lambs and makes several recommendations related to these routine management procedures.

As a result of this report and due to growing pressure on the veterinary profession and resource, there is potential for regulatory changes to be taken forward by the new government.

The NFU is therefore seeking sheep producers' participation in a short survey on the lamb production and husbandry and management methods. (Open to both members and non-members)

This will provide us with a comprehensive understanding of practices within the sector and the necessary information and data to highlight the detrimental impact of introducing restrictions on these routine management procedures.

Store & Breeding Cattle

Prices still keep climbing with confidence from the strong trade in the finished ring. Buyers are keen to fill sheds.

Cows & Calves - A 10 year old Simmental cow sold to £1900 from £1590 for a Hereford and calf from M Turner, his store cattle sold to £1870 for a Limousin heifer with plenty of others £1400 to £1690; AC Downing saw her entry sell to £1310 for an Angus steer, Blues sold to £1300, Saler steers to £1195 and a Friesian steer to £1090; M Finch entered a Belted Galloway steer which sold to £1020 and his Blue heifers sold to £1350 with heifers to £1245, again exceeding their expectations.
