Lighter lambs saw a lift with 40kgs and above now in demand and as ever meat is finding clear premiums. SQQ 246.97p/kg. SJ Hubbard topped the day overall with 43kg Beltex prize winning lambs selling to 360p/kg and £154.80; DM Harris saw comparable highs as Reserve Champion with Bleu D'Maine lambs at 55kgs selling to 270p/kg.

Highlights - NK Butcher topped with a smart run of Texels to 263p/kg for 42kgs; DM & A Andrews followed close behind with Texels to 260p/kg for 41.5kgs; LA Gibbs saw a high for the Suffolks with 44.5kg lambs to 258p/kg; TJ Hyatt penned a well fed, shorn run of Continental and Charollais lambs seeing a premium with 44kgs to 254p/kg; J Underhill saw the same standard with shorn Cheviots to 255p/kg for 46.5kg well meated lambs; Newfield Horses Ltd topped the heavier lambs of the day with a sterling show of Texel ewe lambs topping to 255p/kg for 52kgs, 252.5p/kg for 48.5kgs and 252p/kg for 47.5kgs.

SHEEP VENDORS

New Veterinary Attestation rule for farmers to be introduced on 13th December 2023.

Action Needed Now.....

What's changing?

Changes in legislation, as from 13th December 2023, will require all producers selling livestock for slaughter to have had an annual farm veterinary visit to allow their animals, and/or part of any animal, to be exported out of the UK. The purpose of the new rule is to comply with EU export requirements to verify the absence of notifiable disease and provide general advice on farm biosecurity.

Why is this changing?

The Statutory Health Attestation is required from the 13 December 2023 to certify exports of POAO (Products of Animal Origin) to the EU. The EHCs (Export Health Certificates) require that the animals' farm of origin has undergone regular visits by a veterinary surgeon.

What do producers need to do?

Producers will be required to obtain a signed declaration from their vet that the visit has taken place. The veterinary attestation template can be found here: <u>veterinary attestation template</u>. This should be signed and completed by the farm vet.

Obtaining a signed veterinary attestation must be done at least once over a 12-month period and can be combined with any other routine veterinary visit, including government supported initiatives such as the Animal Health and Welfare Pathway in England.

Farmers and vets must keep a copy of their completed declarations and the "unique reference number" created, for their records and to provide to their livestock auction market or meat processor.

Farms that are part of qualifying assurance schemes do not need to complete the veterinary declaration. Membership of these farm assurance schemes is accepted as evidence that a premises of origin meets the requirement for regular health visits from a vet.

The qualifying schemes are:

- Annual health and welfare review (England only)
- Quality Meat Scotland (QMS)
- Farm Assured Welsh Livestock Beef and Lamb Scheme (FAWL) (Welsh Lamb and Beef Producers Ltd (WLBP))
- Red Tractor




