575 Prime Lambs

A stronger trade and quality to match with heavy meat and lighter quality in demand, a good show of export types with fierce competition ringside. Some leaner lambs still coming forward and would be better sold in the stores. SQQ 304.93p/kg. J Gowling & Sons topped the pence per kilo with 46kg best meat Texel crosses flying to 333p/kg and topping the day overall at £178.50 for 56.5kgs of the same stamp.

Highlights - JI & JA Claypole topped the lighter lambs with Cheviot crosses flying to £142.50 for 45kgs with HD & PJ Cranfield seeing a high of £139.50 for best end Beltex crosses at 39kgs; George Thompson Farms penned a smart run of Continentals seeing their 44.5kgs top to £142, with 39kgs to £139; SJB Luckett & Son topped their Texel crosses to £171 for 51.5kgs; SJ Hubbard topped their Texels with 49kgs at £159; JR Smith & Son drew another quality run of Texel and Charollais crosses seeing highs of £155 for 47.5kgs, 52.5kgs to £171 and 52.5kgs to £170.50; J Patrick saw the best of the Suffolk trade with good shape meated lambs at £174 for 56.5kgs.

NFU SURVEY

NFU are currently conducting a <u>survey about tail docking and castration in</u> <u>lambs</u> to help inform discussions with the government on potential new restrictions.

We kindly ask that you complete the survey, and share the survey with your customers, to gather vital information on the impact of any proposed restrictions to the current practises of tail docking and castration within both farming businesses and the lamb market.

Please see full details and the survey link below.

Tail docking and castration in lambs is considered necessary to manage negative health and welfare impacts caused by fly-strike, or to avoid unwanted pregnancies and complications during post-slaughter processing.

Both procedures are permitted in the UK and governed by legislation however, the <u>Farm Animal Welfare Council's report</u> released in December 2022 discussed the implications of castration and tail docking (which are in the legal terms described as mutilation procedures) on the welfare of lambs and makes several recommendations related to these routine management procedures.

As a result of this report and due to growing pressure on the veterinary profession and resource, there is potential for regulatory changes to be taken forward by the new government.

The NFU is therefore seeking sheep producers' participation in a short survey on the lamb production and husbandry and management methods. (Open to both members and non-members)

This will provide us with a comprehensive understanding of practices within the sector and the necessary information and data to highlight the detrimental impact of introducing restrictions on these routine management procedures.

REPORT FOR SATURDAY 17TH AUGUST

Store & Breeding Cattle

A fantastic trade for all types in the cattle ring with Newlands Farm selling 16-19 month Angus steers to £1135 from £1045 and heifers sold to £1075; Webb Hatherley Livestock saw their 11 month Blue heifers sell to £830, yearling Simmental heifers to £780, 10 month Hereford steers to £715, 11 month Angus heifers sold to £620. The trade saw a 100% clearance topping at £1510.

Calves

Ayrshire bulls sold to £155 and Holstein Friesian bulls sold to £90 from FH Pullin & Sons. This week two Blue heifers, a Blue bull and a Saler will be forward from JEG James.

442 Store Lambs

Trade a bit easier on the week with a larger showing of longer term lambs. Short term lambs have taken a resurgence with trade looking stronger. Longest term lambs continue to look the best sold in comparison. Averaging £82.44. Webb Hatherley Livestock topped the day with Texels in forward condition selling to £128 with followers at £98; GK Doyle saw the trade of the day with Texel and Cheviot crosses selling to £117, £110 and £106; M & M Hutton topped to £114 for Blue Texel crosses in forward condition; CL Fraser & Son continues to draw quality runs of Suffolk and Charollais crosses topping to £107 and £104. Mid term 30kg lambs were seen in the high £80's to mid £90's. Long term lambs were £60 to £75 with ram lambs £15 behind the same size goods.

39 Feeding Ewes

A strong trade for the goods forward, averaging £86.67. D Morgan topped with Continental ewes to £132 with rams to £125; A & L Burr topped the Suffolks with thick ewes to £120, seeing the best of the Mule trade at £119 for lean meat; M Burke topped with young good meat Herdwicks to £114; P Childs topped to £90 for aged Herdwick rams; RD White & Partners saw Herdwicks to £81 with true feeders at £50.




