REPORT FOR SATURDAY 20TH APRIL

Store & Breeding Cattle

JL & L Burton saw a smart entry of 6-7year old Simmental x cows with month old Simmental calves at foot, prices topped at £1480 for outfits in the best condition averaging to £1297.

118 Store cattle

A real week of power with quality entries forward, AL Lamb & Son topped the day with fantastic Saler steers at 19months selling to £1600 for a matching trio.

RD Holland saw comparable highs with a smart showing of Limousins at 18months selling to £1480. PA Wilford saw the best of the native breds with Hereford steers in forward condition topping to £1485 at 26months. JP Watts penned their usual stamp of quality with Limousin steers running through at 25months old and selling to £1310, £1285 and £1230, more of the same quality forward next week with their heifers. H Houghton & Son penned a sterling run of named sire Angus steers at 22-25months topping to £1280 with their British blue steers of the same age selling to £1250 and heifers at £1080. JD Kendall topped the younger cattle of the day with blonde steers at 13months reaching £1320.

194 Store sheep

Store lambs - prices remain at a constant level with meat achieving prices comparable to the prime trade, P Pets topped the day with meat Suffolks selling to £101, A H Hamlyn saw their continentals to £99, GH Rome & Sons penned meat Southdowns at £94. S Yates topped the Jacobs for the day at £83. All in average £69.02

Feeding ewes - quality drives the trade once again and J&S Livestock topped with Millenium Blues selling to £155 with continentals of the same stamp at £154, £146 and £141. S Pearson saw the best for 2tooth Easycares at £111. All In average £96.43

Goats - a surprise entry forward from P Pets with Anglo Nubian cross nanny and kids topping to £64 a life and Pygmy x nannies with 2 kids at £48 a life.

Ewes & Lambs - best show of quality to date with an all in average of £103.48 a life. K Buckby saw another quality production sale of Blue Texel ewes with lambs, best of the day saw a pedigree theave with a ewe lamb at foot sell to £199 a life or £398 the outfit. Topping the outfits overall saw a pure bred Theave with 2 ewe lambs at foot sell to £180 a life or £540 the outfit. The full mouth ewes and single lambs topped to £162 a life, 8 lots sold above £130 a life with all at £120 plus. J&S Livestock saw a quality draw of Grade 4 Dutch Spotted ewes and their Dutch spotted lambs at foot topping to £105 a life for the double Theaves. T Sansom penned a run of quality with full mouth Texel ewes and strong lambs topping at £97 a life. HUNTINGDONSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL - NEW LOCAL PLAN

Huntingdonshire District Council have agreed to start the preparation of a full update to their Adopted Local Plan which will set out how the District will grow over future decades. The Local Plan will set out a plan for future sustainable development in the District and it will perform two specific roles.

- Identify key areas of land for development to deliver homes, jobs and services needed in the District, and
- Include Policies against which all future planning applications will be considered.

Part of the review of the Local Plan will include a Call for Sites exercise which will run until Wednesday 7 June 2023. Landowners are being invited to submit sites with potential for:

- Residential use (such as housing, specialist homes, moorings, care homes etc.)
- Commercial use (such as retail, leisure, industrial, logistics etc.)
- Infrastructure (such as health uses, community facilities, renewable energy etc.)
- Open Space use (such as sports and recreation, allotments, biodiversity net gain, flooding safeguarding etc.)

For sites to be included in the Local Plan they must be capable of delivering five or more dwellings for residential sites, or 0.25 hectares (500 sq m) for commercial sites. We will be submitting sites on behalf of landowners to this process, along with supporting information and if you should have any land which you feel should be promoted through the Emerging Local Plan then please contact a member of the Planning and Development Team and we will be happy to assist you.
